Finished with a soft cotton fringe, Tanami balances understated design with casual simplicity, offering a supple, textural anchor for contemporary interiors.

CARE INSTRUCTIONS

Do not wash or dry clean. Remove spills immediately by blotting the area with a clean white cloth and a wool-friendly detergent. Gently dab at the mark, never rub. Remove excess moisture by dabbing gently at the area with a dry towel. Dry the area as quickly as possible by placing the floor rug in a breezy or warm and dry area of the house. For a deep clean we recommend using a skilled specialist.

Initial shedding is common as the fibres settle. Lightly vacuum regularly using suction only. Avoid using a brush head, as this can cause matting of the fibres. Take extra care when vacuuming fringed or tasselled edges. You can also shake your floor rug outside to remove dust and dirt.

MANUFACTURING VARIATIONS & CONSIDERATIONS

This floor rug has been handcrafted by artisan makers. Although we strive for consistency in our products, the complex nature of this process may reveal minor variations.

SIZE This can vary +/- 3% from the size specified.

COLOUR You may notice slight colour variations from samples, online, and print images. As many of our products are handmade from natural fibres and materials, there may also be minor variations between production runs and dye batches. Every effort is made to ensure these are minimal and within textile industry standards.

SPROUTING Sprouting occurs when fibre ends wriggle loose and appear above the natural pile height of the rug. Sprouting is common in handwoven rugs and not considered a fault. To maintain a neat appearance, simply trim the loose fibres with scissors to match the surrounding pile.
