

## Vale Floor Rug

Inspired by aerial photography and geological layering, the Vale is a stunning focal point to style your room around. Handtufted in a soft wool-viscose blend, the muted tones of ivory, sage, grey and ochre are easily paired with complementary interior accents. Use the circular design to zone an area or anchor key pieces of furniture.

### CARE INSTRUCTIONS

Do not wash or dry clean. Remove spills immediately by blotting the area with a clean dry white cloth. Do not use water on a viscose blend floor rug, as this may cause a yellowing of the fibres. Remove excess moisture by gently dabbing the area, never rub. We recommend using a stain remover suitable for viscose fibres. Dry the area as quickly as possible by placing the floor rug in a breezy or warm and dry area of the house. For a deep clean we recommend using a skilled specialist.

Initial shedding is common as the fibres settle. Lightly vacuum regularly using suction only. Avoid using a brush head, as this can cause matting of the fibres. You can also shake your floor rug outside to remove dust and dirt.

### MANUFACTURING VARIATIONS & CONSIDERATIONS

This floor rug has been handcrafted by artisan makers. Although we strive for consistency in our products, the complex nature of this process may reveal minor variations.

**SIZE** This can vary +/- 3% from the size specified.

**COLOUR** You may notice slight colour variations from samples, online, and print images. As many of our products are handmade from natural fibres and materials, there may also be minor variations between production runs and dye batches. Every effort is made to ensure these are minimal and within textile industry standards.

**SPROUTING** Sprouting occurs when fibre ends wriggle loose and appear above the natural pile height of the rug. Sprouting is common in handwoven rugs and not considered a fault. To maintain a neat appearance, simply trim the loose fibres with scissors to match the surrounding pile.
